Record CLIAs Event, Puke's Dual Win

Close to 600 cruise experts gathered for the 23rd Cruise Industry Awards in Sydney, and the record turnout was an opportunity to celebrate those who 'set the benchmark', says CLIA Australasia boss Joel Katz.

"They elevate the entire industry through their commitment to excellence," he added. Pukekohe Travel was arguably the biggest Kiwi winner at the cruise awards, named New Zealand's *Single Location Cruise Agency of the Year*, while the company's Lisa Wharfe won the prestigious *New Zealand Cruise Consultant of the Year* title. Pukekohe Travel director Damian O'Connor says the agency win was 'absolutely sensational', and a massive team effort. His advice for others looking to follow in his footsteps is to innovate and look after your team. "Just keep trying, keep pushing, keep thinking, keep innovating," he says. "Don't sit still, and have amazing staff and look after them."

O'Connor says the team couldn't do it without multi-award-winning Wharfe. "This is the most amazing, superstar, outstanding cruise

consultant New Zealand has ever seen." Wharfe says the agency win is testament to what it has been working hard for over the past few years. Touching on her personal win, Wharfe says she

was 'totally blown away'.

"It's taken me by surprise. It's just such a great calibre of people that are up for this award; it's a dream come true."

A humble Wharfe attributes her win to Pukekohe Travel, who she has been with for some 15 years.

"I'm very very lucky to work for who I work for. I'd love to thank all the management at Pukekohe Travel for all they've done to support me...also the colleagues I work with."

Her advice, to other agents, is to follow your dreams and passions, look after who you work with, and support suppliers. This year's awards attracted 1200 nominations, the highest number ever received. Katz says the cruise body has never had so much involvement from its ANZ agent members. EK Resumes Flights

Emirates' first flight from Dubai to Auckland since the airspace closure touched down on Sat, and the carrier says it will operate some services AKL-DXB over the coming days. Those flights operating, with changes to departure times, include EK448 DXB-AKL on 09 Mar, departing at 1005 and EK449 AKL-DXB on 10 Mar, departing at 2105. From 11 Mar onwards, EK says EK449 AKL-DXB and EK448 DXB-AKL will operate as scheduled.

MCT Operations

Muscat International Airport is operating normally and continues to accept guests transiting via Muscat or stopping over. WY will operate extra flights between MCT and destinations including London Heathrow, Istanbul, Bangkok, Kuala Lumpur, Cairo and Mumbai. See the GDS for updated schedules. 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QR's Doha Schedule

Qatar Airways' scheduled flights remain temporarily suspended, due to the closure of Qatari airspace, although it has gained permission to operate a few select flights. The Qatar CAA temporarily authorised a limited operating corridor that will allow Hamad International Airport to receive select Northern Hemisphere flights whose final destination is Doha. This follows a series of repatriation flights on 08 Mar to AMS, BER, FRA, LHR and ZRH, which prioritised stranded passengers with families, elderly passengers, and those with urgent medical and compassionate travel needs. The self-famil packages also give agents access to a range of discounted accommodation options and experiences including diving, fishing, hiking and cultural encounters. War Looks To Be A Heavy Hit For Air NZ

Loss-making Air New Zealand is exposed to additional daily fuel costs of \$4m to \$5m a day as oil prices spiral, say analysts.

Forsyth Barr says the carrier has suffered increased costs since the pandemic, irrespective of fuel price issues, more so than many of its international competitors.

Higher for longer jet fuel prices may mean greater structural changes as a result of NZ's strategy review, the analysts say.

The growing gap between the price of crude oil and refined jet fuel, is concerning for the global aviation industry. Margins soared from USD45 to USD145, described as "unprecedented."

Forsyth Barr says refiners' margins were already causing a problem for NZ (which uses about 22,000

barrels of jet fuel a day) and this was reflected in its half year loss of \$59m.

Into the next financial year, most of NZ's fuel is unhedged, meaning it is exposed to market prices.

... Shares Tumble

The Middle East crisis has sent airline stocks tumbling. Last week the Arca Airline Index slid nearly 15% in the United States. NZ's share price, which was already weak, dropped 7% last week. Across the Tasman Qantas shares slid 10% last week while the impact on Flight Centre was more modest - it suffered a 5.8% dip.

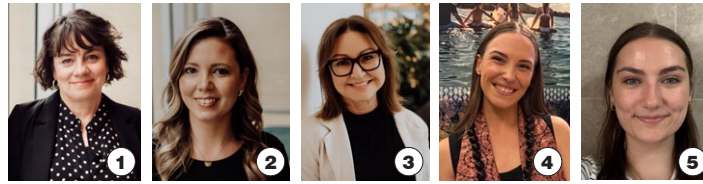
